
Electronic Gate Will Ease Entry to Mason Neck State Park



Mason Neck State Park is in the process of completing installation of an electronic gate at the park's entrance. Currently, the gate is manually unlocked each morning at 8 am and closed at dusk. The electronic gate will automatically open at sunrise and close again at dusk. A pressure pad on the exit gate will allow cars to exit after the gates close. The electronic gate will be a real benefit to early-morning birdwatchers, paddlers, and others who like to get started before 8 AM. The gate will be operational in the next few weeks. 
The Friends' Accessibility Advisor Kris Gulden found a Great Blue Heron gulping down a huge fish at Blackwater Wildlife Refuge a couple of weeks ago. Herons will eat almost anything, including small mammals, snakes and other birds. They normally eat smaller prey than this, but they're known to eat very large fish from time to time.

Normally, we only use photos taken at Mason Neck State Park in our Photo of the Month feature. We made an exception this time because Great Blue Herons are so common in the park, and the photos were so unusual.

Volunteer Needed to Monitor Bluebird Boxes at the Park During Nesting Season

All-Terrain Wheelchair Bill Passes the Virginia General Assembly



The Virginia General Assembly has passed HB1186, a bill providing for a two-year pilot program providing all-terrain power wheelchairs to be used by visitors at state parks. The bill was introduced by Delegate Kathy Tran, who represented the area that includes Mason Neck State park until last year's redistricting. Delegate Rozia Henson, who now represents the area that includes the park, and Senator David Marsden co-sponsored the bill. The bill is now awaiting action by Governor Youngkin. It is likely that Mason Neck State Park will receive one of the wheelchairs, which will be made available to visitors free of charge.
